Important Allergy Information - Nuts and Seeds

We have a number of children in school with nut allergies and also sesame seed allergies. Exposure to nuts and seeds can cause anaphylactic shock which is potentially life threatening.

School meal menus are designed to be free of nuts and seeds but we need your help if your child has packed lunch. **Please do not send your child to school with a packed lunch containing items with nuts and seeds.** This includes items such as seeded bread rolls or crackers, cereal bars, Nutella, peanut butter etc.

Could I please remind parents once again to take care when picking up children at the end of the day and park legally and considerately.

We still have parents blocking driveways, doing 3 point turns whilst children are trying to cross, parking in Morley Court's private car park and ignoring the road markings. It is causing frustration for local residents and creating a dangerous environment for our children as they enter and leave school.
