## Year 1 Essentials: Every Day

- Children should arrive and be picked up at their designated time:

## **Visible Learning**

This year we are continuing our work as a school on 'Visible Learning'.

### What is Visible Learning?

Visible Learning is an approach to teaching and learning based on John Hattie's vast database of research in education. Its aim is to ensure that teachers are clear about what they are teaching and how and why they're teaching it; and, most importantly, children are clear about what they are learning, how and why they are learning it and what they need to do next.

#### What are the learning dispositions at Morley?

Our learning dispositions are the 'habits of thinking' we need to develop in order to be good learners.

At Morley, we want everyone to know that good learners are:

reflective, collaborative, resilient, curious, courageous and motivated.

### Visible Learning How can families help?

#### Talking about the learning rather than the doing

That could be as simple as asking: "What did you learn today?" instead of "What did you do today?" "What were you curious about? Did you ask any good questions?" "What was tricky in your learning? Did you have to be courageous?"

### Using the terms & noticing the behaviours in different contexts

It can help to build a stronger understanding of what we mean by these terms if they are used in a variety of contexts. The following activities might help.

talking about characters in books and films

pointing out when your child shows resilience if they persist with a tricky lego model that keeps breaking or if they are courageous physically (on the monkey bars at the park) or socially (talking to somebody clearly and politely)

keeping a note of this to reflect on together or just complimenting them in the moment! <u>discussing this booklet</u> (to help with breaking the dispositions into steps)

#### **Encouraging their application**

You can point out which disposition they'll need when finding something tricky in their homework: "Hmm that's not working. We'll need to be reflective and find a new solution." "Wow! This is really tricky. We're going to need to be resilient and keep on working at it." Eventually, you should be able to ask them to identify which dispositions they'll need to show.

### Year 1 What is different in Year 1?

Children work more at tables. They learn to take turns, work in pairs, groups and independently.

Children learn to stay focussed on a task and how to set out their work neatly and clearly.

Children learn to ask and answer questions respectfully, listening to others and joining in politely.

Children are learning personal organisation skills e.g. keeping track of clothing, tying shoelaces, putting book-bags away, remembering the routines. These skills can also be practised at home!

Children learn positive behaviour showing respect and consideration towards peers, adults and school environment, taking responsibility for our own actions. Each class has agreed class rules, rewards and sanctions. **See School Behaviour Policy** 

### Year 1 What is different in 2020?

We are sat in rows so children have learning partners We have to minimise movement around the classroom Break time with Year 1 only Lunch in class

### What are we doing to help with all of this?

Children have playful activities to access on their tables Treasure baskets Phonics games

Colouring / drawing equipment to use

Queue activities: stories, counting, interactive whiteboard games, number and phonic fact practice

Daily mindfulness / relaxation.

## Year 1 Essentials: Home Learning

#### **Assigned home learning**

- This will be given weekly in a book
- It will be related to learning in school.
- Homework may be research, writing, maths or discussion based.
  Please support your children and record a comment in the homework
  book. Usually handed out on a Friday and returned by Wednesday
  morning please.
- Supporting school learning The school website has class pages
  that are updated half termly. A yearly learning overview for Y1 is
  attached to these pages as will be this talk. There is also handwriting
  guidance, spellings and handouts showing Maths, Reading, Writing
  Age Related Expectations.

## Year 1 Reading



- Children read in whole class English and Phonics lessons, and with a class adult regularly. **Please read at home daily.**
- Children are set a colour book band and are helped to change their book initially, before being expected to change their book independently once we are allowed. Reading a book several times will help practice key words, so don't feel you only need to read a book once.
- Reading is assessed in line with our school assessment policy.
- Reading record books are used for home and school reading. Please record when you hear your child read.

## Year 1 Helping at Home Key English Skills



- Practise correct letter formation: use the correct handwriting formation sheet.
- Learn the 1<sup>st</sup> 100 high frequency words, children need to be able to read and spell these words.
- Read regularly (see Tips for Reading on webpage).
- Practise learning and reciting simple rhymes and poems.
- Practise retelling traditional tales and other well loved stories.
- Write at every opportunity (lists, letters, labels, postcards for play and real-life purposes).

## Year 1 Helping at Home Key Maths Skills



Practice counting forwards and backwards in 1s, (and then 2s, 5s and 10s.)

Practise number formation, reading and spelling number words.

Learn number bonds to 10: 0+10, 1+9, 2+8 etc Learn number bonds for all numbers to 10: E.g. for 7 0+7 1+6 2+5 3+4 4+3 5+2 6+1 7+0

Practise telling the time on the hour.

Bake and weigh ingredients.

Look at the value of coins and play shops.

Talk about Maths! (Hints and tips to follow in Home Learning sheets, sent home in homework books)
